#### TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### First Reading: Genesis 3:9-15

God asked Adam why he ate the fruit from the forbidden tree. Adam blames his companion, who in turn blames a serpent. God then told the serpent it would be banned from other animals, and be an enemy of humanity.

#### Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

Paul describes our belief that "He who raised up the Lord Jesus will raise us up along with Jesus." Although our bodies grow weaker, each day our inner strength grows. Paul also describes our burdens as light when compared to the eternal rewards we can attain.

#### Gospel: Mark 3:20-35

Some of the scribes felt that Jesus was possessed and claimed that he expelled demons with help from Satan. Jesus silenced them by asking, "How can Satan expel Satan?" Jesus also warned them that although many sins would be forgiven, blasphemy against the Holy Spirit would not. Jesus was then told that his mother, brother and sisters were asking for him. He asked, "Who are my mother and brother and sisters? Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me." This demonstrates Jesus' deep love for all those who love God.

Guided tours, sightseeing, and admission fres. Hotel taxes, service charges, and baggage handling (where possible). ITINERARY

Day 1 Sep 10. 2024 - Tuesday: DEPARTURE You will leave from the USA with an overnight flight to Istanbul. Turkey.

Day 2 Sep 11, 2024 - Wednesday: ISTANBUL

#### Welcome to Turkey. You are greeted by your tour guide and transferred to the hotel. Dinner and overnight in Istanbul.

Day 3 Sep 12, 2024 - Thursday: ISTANBUL - OLD CITY Full-day city tour of magnificent Istanbul, the city that links continents Asia and Europe to each other. We will drive to the Cathedral of St. Esprit Church for morning Mass. Then drive to old city center to visit the famous Blue Mosque, built in the 17th century by the Ottomans, famous for the blue Iznik tiles decorating its interior walls. A short walk will bring us to the magnificent former Christian Basilica, Hagia Sophia, built in the 6th century - the world's largest church for over 1,000 years. Then we will have a boat trip on the Bosphorus that separates two continents. Europe and Asia. Dinner and overnight in Istanbul. Day 4 Sep 13, 2024 - Friday: ISTANBUL - TROY - CANAKKALE

After breakfast, we will celebrate Mass at St. Anthony Padua Church. Then, we will drive along the Sea of Marmara to Canakkale. Visit Troy- home of the legendary Helen of Troy and the Trojan Horse. Dinner and overnight in Canakkale.

#### Day 5 Sep 14, 2024 - Saturday: CANAKKALE - PERGAMUM - KUSADASI

After breakfast, we will drive to Pergamum, one of the Seven Churches of Revelation. (Rev 2: 12-17). Visit the Acropolis to see the remains of the Altar of Zeus, believed to be the throne of Satan referred to in the Bible. These are the words of him who has the sharp, double-edged sword. I know where you livewhere Satan has his throne. Yet you remain true to my name. You did not remounce your faith in me, not even in the days of Antipas, my faithful witness, who was put to death in your city where Satan lives." See also the steepest theater in the world, and the remains of the famous Temple of Trajan, with magnificent views overlooking the modern town of Bergama. After visiting the Aeropolis, drive to Izmir (ancient Smyrna) to celebrate Mass. After Mass, drive to Kusadasi for dinner and overnight.

#### Day 6 Sep. 15 - Sunday: KUSADASI - HOUSE OF VIRGIN MARY, EPHESUS - KUSADASI

After breakfast, we will drive to Ephesus where St. Paul lived and preached for three years, and to where he subsequently sent his letter to the Ephesians. First, we will visit the House of Mother Mary where she spent the later years of her life. Celebrate the mass at the House of the Virgin Mary. Then, continue to Ephesus, one of the most important biblical sites of modern Turkey. Ephesus is one of the Seven Churches of Revelation (Rev 2: 1-7) and the home to the tomb of St. John the Apostle where he served as bishop. We will walk in the footsteps of St. Paul. St. John. and Mother Mary as you wander along the marble roads of Ephesus. We will also visit the Church of Mary, where the 3rd Ecumenical Council was held. Return to your hotel in Kusadasi for dinner and overnight.

Day 7 Sep. 16. 2024 - Monday: KUSADASI - LAODICEA: HIERAPOLIS - KUSADASI After breakfast, drive to Laodicea, one of the Seven Churches of Asia Minor [Rev. 1:11; 3:14; Col. 2:1; 4:13-16]. The geographic location of the city explains why the Laodiceans were "neither hot nor cold but lukewam" as it says in the Bible., Then we will continue to biblical Hierapolis, an Roman ancient city where St. Philip was martyred during the persecutions ordered by Domitian. Visit the tomb of St. Philip which was recently discovered here. Hierapolis is also famous for its snow-like landscape formed as a result of mineral deposits from the thermal sources in the area. Return to Kusadasi for dinner and overnight. Day 8 Sep. 17, 2024 - Tuesday: KUSADASI - PATMOS

Transfer to the pier in Kusadasi to embark on a cruise ship. Patmos Island is considered sacred and is often referred to as the "Jerusalem of the Aegean". It was here that the Evangelist St. John received inspiration for the Apocalypse. We will celebrate the mass at St. John's Grotto. After the mass, visit the Monastery of St. John, a huge fortress-like building dating from the 11th century.

#### Day 9 Sep. 18, 2024 - Wednesday: RHODES

This morning the ship will stop at the Greek island of Rhodes. You can enjoy the beautiful island on your own or join the optional trip to visit the Monastery of Filerimos, dedicated to the Virgin Mary, and the Citadel of the Knights.

This moming the ship will stop at the Greek island of Crete. Visit the island on your own or take an optional trip to visit the ruins of the Palace of Knossos. the elaborate Palace is believed to be the mythical Labyrinth of King Minos and the seat of ancient Minoan culture. Afternoon we will visit the Island of Santorini. This island is perhaps the most breathtaking of all the Greek Islands. In the town of Thira white washed houses, narrow streets, open air cafes, and glittering boutiques eling to cliffs, accessible by cable car or mule. Visit the island on your own or take an optional trip offered by the cruise lines.

After disembarking the cruise ship in Lavrion, we will meet our guide and drive to Athens. We will embark on a city tour and celebrate Mass at the Cathedral
